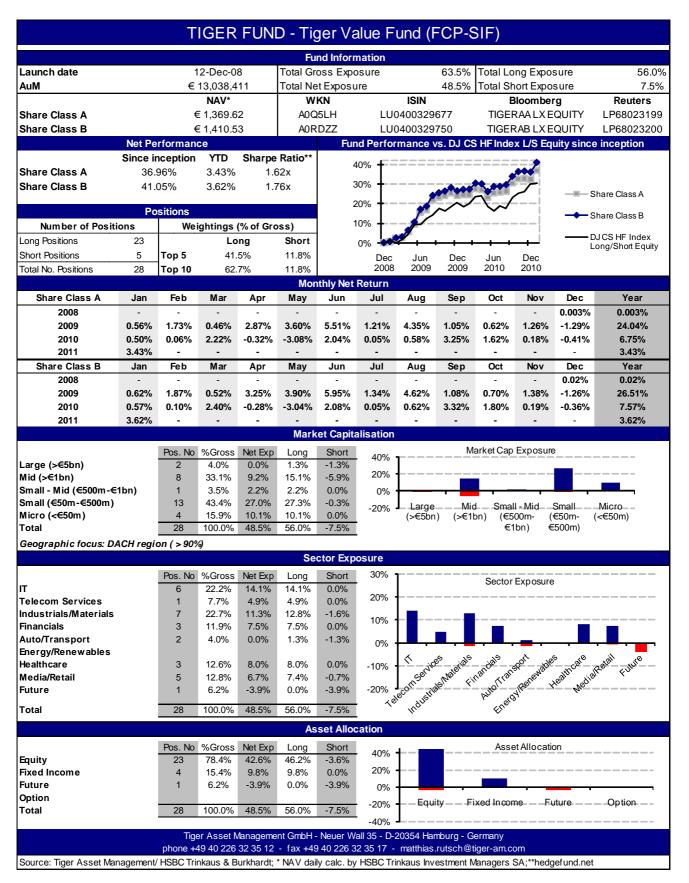

Tiger Value Fund - January 2011

o Returns: Up +3.43% (class A)/3.62% (class B)

In January the Tiger Value Fund had a positive net return of +3.43% for share class A and 3.62% for share class B, making a cumulative positive net return of +36.96% / +41.05% since inception and an annualized rate of return of +16.30% / +17.95% since inception (share class A/B).

o Commentary: Good attributions from new fund positions

During January the Fund profited from our alpha stock picks. We booked some profits and reduced our net exposure from 56% to 49% and around 39% beta-adjusted as of end of January.

With our Sharpe Ratio of 1.76x (class B) and 1.62x (class A) we are ranked no. 54 and 66 out of 1,625 long/short equity hedge funds worldwide at www.hedgefund.net.

The performance was very broad based and the losers were rather small and limited in numbers. Our top three contributors of our new positions which we entered in December were: Gigaset ("Arques"/+72bp), bet-at-home (+49bp) and Stada (+38bp). The top three contributors of our holdings were we have been invested for a while were: Tipp24 (+69bp), Kontron (+50bp), and Eurohypo (+49bp). Our position in Eurohypo profited from a tender offer of Commerzbank which was 15% above its market price. We didn't tender our hybrid bonds at 57% as the risk-reward ratio has become even more attractive, i.e. mid-term upside of nearly 100% and limited downside.

In January our hedges also contributed positively as we booked profits on our single shorts which added +72bp to the Fund's performance while the MDAX Future hedge cost us -3bp.

O Discussion: bet-at-home = growth and cash machine

We hold a smaller position in bet-at-home AG (ACX GY, €30) a top European online betting and gambling provider. For 2010 we expect the company to announce around €1.3bn gambling volume and revenues > €66m (> 54% growth y-o-y).

Bet-at-home gained market share from competitors as the company heavily invested its cash flows in marketing campaigns over the last couple of years. The company probably also profited from its > 50% stake holder Mangas Gaming which is backed by Prince Albert from Monaco. Bet-at-home has tremendous economies of scale as marketing expenditures account for > 70% of the company's operating expenses which is around 3x the company's EBIT 2010e.

On our numbers the company trades at EV/EBIT 2011e of < 3x and PER 2011e of around 5x, well below peers such as BWIN which trades at > 20x PER 2011e. In our growth scenario we assumed 30% higher marketing expenses and 40% top-line growth for 2011. In our stable growth scenario, were we modeled a churn rate of around 20% and cut marketing expenses by 80%, bet-at-home trading multiples look even more attractive with 1.5x EBIT 2011e and < 3x PER 2011e. But this scenario lowers our DCF valuation range, i.e. limits the long-term upside potential of the company. In any case the company's valuation looks extremely undemanding, also given its leading market position and strong growth prospects profiting from the ongoing gambling liberalization trend in Europe.

o Outlook: Massive liquidity inflows; margin squeeze?

We believe that the acceleration of the US economy and its positive effects on global growth coupled with massive flow of liquidity (re-allocation from bonds into equity, M&A, dividends, buy-backs, etc.) in the next few months potentially will drive valuations to new highs.

Although we are quite confident that the bull market continues we are well prepared to see some disappointments. While the strong demand from Asia and low commodity prices supported the recovery of the EBITDA margins in 2010 after the trough in 2009, times have clearly changed. Improving leading economic indicators triggered a strong recovery in raw material prices. We believe that raw material price increases will hurt companies especially those with low pricing power across various sectors. This is a key risk for a potential temporary margin squeeze in 2011. Also the restrictive monetary policy of countries such as China and India to tame inflation could be a risk to German companies with high emerging market exposure as GDP growth in Asia is set to cool down.

We have positioned the fund in what we believe to be the potential beneficiaries from these themes: investments in companies with strong cash flows, high dividend payments, take-over candidates and companies that will be less affected by raw material price changes. We also believe that our defensive and technology plays coupled with strong catalysts offer the most attractive risk reward profiles. At the same time we intensified our research on the short side and may gradually reduce our net exposure as the year progresses.

We are very pleased with our new subscriptions which lifted the Tiger Value Fund assets to €14.3m at the beginning of February. Our next subscription deadline for the Tiger Value Fund is 21 February 2011 at 5pm.

Objectives

The objective is to identify undervalued companies with external catalysts and/or initiate pro-active measures to create shareholder value. The fund aims for a 5 year return of 10-15% p.a. with strong focus on capital preservation.

Investment Strategy

The Investment Advisor is a fundamental long-short equity stock-picker. The fund seeks undervalued small and midcap companies where a number of issues, which in our opinion can be improved, are sub-optimizing the company's public market value. For each position we perform a detailed research process including a 360 degree research approach and 10 point scoring system.

The managers foresee a direct dialog with the company as well as with other shareholders to support management to initiate value creating measures. Their partner network i.e. other shareholders, consultants, sector experts, media etc. will help to impact positive change.

The fund intends to engage in 15-30 long investments with a target net long exposure of around 50%. The geographic focus is likely to be Germany, Switzerland and Austria.
